

Canon PowerShot A4000 IS Display Replacement

This guide demonstrates how to remove the LCD screen of your PowerShot camera.

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TOOLS:

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- Phillips #000 Screwdriver (1)
- Spudger (1)

Step 1 — Removing the Screws




- First remove the batteries and memory card.
- Remove the screws for the back cover (circled in red) with a Phillips head screwdriver (PH000) .



Step 2 — Removing the Back Cover


• The back cover can be gently pried off after the screws are removed.

Step 3 — Disconnecting the Screen Frame from the Camera




• Remove the three screws outlined in the pictures.

Step 4



- The ribbon for the screen is folded under the plate. Carefully unfold the ribbon by flipping the screen face down next to the camera.
- Underneath the plate the connection between the camera and the ribbon can be viewed.

Step 5 — Disconnecting the Ribbon and Removing the Screen



• The metal frame of the screen can be removed using a thin spatula or spudger. After the frame is removed the part of the ribbon connected to the screen is accessible.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
